R.A. Horn Outstanding Student Award

The R.A. Horn Outstanding Achievement Award is presented to one exemplary special education student from each of Ohio's sixteen State Support Team (SST) regions. This award was established by the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce.

School district officials are invited to nominate students for this award in the spring of each year. Each nominee is considered by an appointed SST-9 committee which then selects one recipient to be recognized at an awards ceremony hosted by the Ohio Coalition for the Education of Children with Disabilities.

This award is named in honor of the late Dr. Raymond A. Horn, Assistant Superintendent of Public Instruction Emeritus. This prestigious award recognizes students' remarkable performances. Acknowledged as a national leader in the field of special education, Dr. Horn devoted more than 60 years of service to improving the quality of life and learning for students with disabilities. Franklin B. Walter Outstanding Educator Award

The Franklin B. Walter Outstanding Educator Award is presented to one educator (or a team of educators) from each of Ohio's sixteen State Support Team (SST) regions, who has/have made extraordinary contributions to the education of students with disabilities.

School district officials are invited to nominate educators for this award in the spring of each year. Each nominee/team is considered by an appointed SST-9 committee who then selects one recipient/ team to be recognized at an awards ceremony. This event is hosted annually by the Ohio Coalition for the Education of Children with Disabilities.

This award is named in honor of Dr. Franklin B. Walter, Superintendent of Public Instruction from 1977 until 1991, a post held longer than any other state superintendent in Ohio's history. With over 50 years of service as a teacher and administrator, Dr. Walter's leadership is evident in many of Ohio's quality educational initiatives and programs. Among these is the development of the nation's first statewide plan for children with disabilities.

Dr. Karen M. Williams was passionate about ensuring every student had equal opportunities for a hopeful future. She possessed a deep love for education, her fellow educators, and improving the lives of students.

Dr. Williams had over 30 years of professional expertise in the field of education. She started her teaching career in 1969, and she earned a Master of Arts in Secondary Education and a Doctor of Education in Educational Administration. She served as an English teacher, Elementary Principal, Administrative/Curriculum Specialist, Director of Curriculum, and as an Assistant Superintendent. Dr. Williams also served as a consultant for State Support Team Region 9.

In her honor, State Support Team 9 established the Dr. Karen M. Williams Leadership Award to honor a leader whose efforts have improved the quality of education and opportunities for all students.

Dr. Williams continues to be an inspiration to countless people. Her legacy continues through this award.

This year's recipient of the Dr. Karen M. Williams Leadership Award is Ann Gerber, Curriculum/Gifted Coordinator for Norwayne Local Schools, located in Creston, OH (Wayne County).

Ann Gerber was nominated by one of her former students, Lance Larrison, who had Ann as his eighth-grade language arts teacher. Mr. Larrison is currently a high school teacher and colleague of Ann's at Norwayne High School. In his nomination letter, Mr. Larrison stated, "Mrs. Gerber, like Dr. Williams, has a deep love for education, a devout commitment in the betterment of others, and an unmistakable trademark of compassion and tenderness to everyone she meets."

Ann Gerber has held several different positions throughout her tenure that has allowed her to expand her influence. These positions include teaching first grade (Waynedale); fifth grade (Rittman); Gifted instructor for grades three-six (Norwayne) and eighth grade ELA (Norwayne). In addition, she has served as Power of the Pen writing coach (now called Just Write Ohio) from 1999- present. From 2012-2015 Ann was the Tournament Director for Power of the Pen.

Ann Gerber sets high expectations for herself as well as those in her purview. Mrs. Gerber is a summa cum laude graduate from The University of Akron (1986) where she received her Bachelor of Science degree in elementary education; in 2000 she graduated summa cum laude from Ashland University where she earned her master's degree in Curriculum and Instruction. Additionally, in 1997 she received the WCSCC Distinguished Alumni Award and in 2003 Ann became a Martha Holden Jennings Scholar.

In addition to her heart as an educator, Ann Gerber has engaged in mission trips to the Jamaican Deaf Village as well as to the Agua Prieta Orphanage in Mexico. A solid woman of faith, Ann deeply believes that "making others feel wanted, known, and loved" is a powerful way to put the heart of Jesus on display.

After 37 years in education, Mrs. Gerber will conclude her career this June, having touched countless student and staff members' lives and having left her positive impact on those fortunate enough to know her and to have benefited from her leadership. Lance stated that "Mrs. Gerber was that 'one teacher' who inspired him to go into education." May we all be so blessed to have an "Ann Gerber" in our lives.
